I completed a BA in Archaeology in Université Laval, Québec, Canada, in 2006, and obtained a MA degree at the same university in 2009. My MA research project was done under the supervision of Drs. Allison Bain and James Woollett.

In October 2009 I began a PhD at the University of Aberdeen, under the supervision of Drs. Karen Milek and Andrew J. Dugmore (U. of Edinburgh). My doctoral project aims to develop and test an analytical model for the study of past daily life, using archaeoentomology within a multidisciplinary framework. This model will be applied to the reconstruction of the environmental conditions inside three 19th- early 20th century northern Icelandic farms: Vatnsfjörður (Westfjords), Hornbrekka (Skagafjörður), and Thverá (Laxárdalur).

My research interests include Icelandic archaeology, environmental archaeology (especially archaeoentomology), experimental archaeology, household archaeology, studies about living conditions and hygiene and site formation processes.
