Mike is an environmental archaeologist who works across the North Atlantic islands of Atlantic Scotland, Faroes, Iceland and Greenland. He is a field with specialisms in archaeobotany, geoarchaeology and geochronology. His key research theme is the investigation of the interaction between humans and the environment through reconstructing and analyzing a) trajectories of environmental change, b) the impact of human settlement on palaeoenvironments, c) palaeoeconomies in different island settings and d) cultural adjustments to marginality and rapid environmental change. His is co-investigator on a number of interdisciplinary research projects including an IPY project on Human Ecodynamics in the Norse North Atlantic (NSF funded), the Heart of the Atlantic project in the Faroes (Anadarko, BP, Leverhulme Trust, NSF and Faroese Research Council funded) and the Uig Landscape Survey in the Western Isles of Scotland (Historic Scotland funded). Mike is a lecturer in archaeological science in Durham and adjunct faculty on the CUNY Doctoral Program in Anthropology.
