As an ecological economist, Caroline's research focuses on the human dimensions of land use change including development of collaborative processes in environmental decision–making, valuation of ecosystem goods and services, and modeling of human–ecosystem interactions. Current research looks at human–nature interactions and land–use change in the northeastern United States from 1600–2100, focusing on understanding historical land–use change from an ecosystem services perspective. Past research includes development of hydrologic–economic systems models for arid regions; quantifying the social costs and benefits of protected marine areas; valuation of river resources and the environmental, economic and social impacts of river management; and measurement of environmental, economic and social impacts of commercial logging and the changing nature of private forest ownership in the Northern Forests of the Northeast.
