Times are all Icelandic (EDT + 4 hours, UK – 1 hour, DK SW – 2 hours). Apologies for early AM North America.

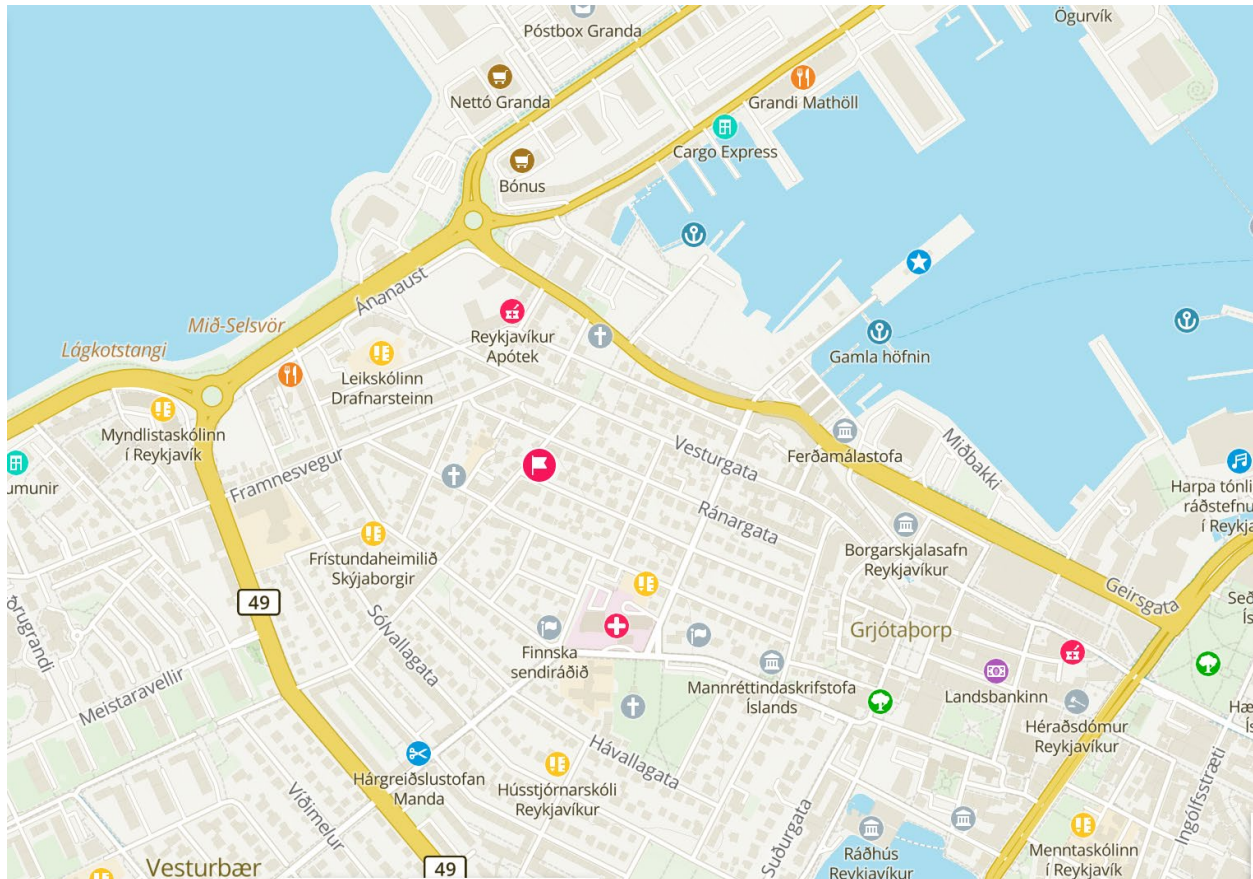
